

#### INTRODUCTION

### CHAPTER-I

## Report

- 1.1 The Water Resources Department is one of the most important Departments of the Government of Assam. The problems of floor, erosion and drainage ecosystem are chronic problem of the state which has crippled the entire economic besides entraining enormous flood damage and causing measures to the people at large. Sometimes life line to the Northeast is disrupted because of devastating floods.
- 1.2 Flood control activities in Assam started after announcement of National Policy for Flood in 1954 by the Govt. of India, though there was short term and long term measures in National Flood Policy 1954, to get the immediate relief to the flood ravaged State, construction of embankment as short quickly with local resources and abundant man-power to protect large area with comparatively smaller outlays.
- 1.3 The Department performed works under the name Public Works Department (PWD) till 1970 when the Department along with Irrigation Department bifurcated from the parent Department I.e. P.W.D. vide Notification No. ABP/135/70/10 dated 18/09/1970. Again in the year 1974, the Irrigation Department was separated out from the Flood Control Department vide notification No.ABP.74/73/Pt/7 dated 22/01/1974. Lastly the Department was renamed as Water Resources Department in the year 2002 vide notification No.AR/21/2002/4 dated 01/11/2002.
- The Govt. of Assam had constituted a Technical Advisory Committee in June, 1970 to advise the Department on the technical viability of various schemes proposed and formulated at different field levels. On recommendation of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), detail project report is prepared for the consideration of the Assam State Brahmaputra Valley Flood Control Board (ASBVFC Board) the scheme is sent to the Department Finance Committee/Standing Finance Committee/Special Standing Finance Committee for according Administrative Approval. On accordance of the Administrative approval, the scheme is ready for execution after observing other formalities like N.I.T. etc.

One of the main problems faced by the Department is maintenance of flood Management structures particularly during the flood time. The department has 4486.44 Km of embankment and 939 Nos. of minor sluices and erosion work along with 101 Nos. of major and 545 Nos. of minor sluices and 892.216 Km of drainage channel. Most of the embankment are construction during 1954 to 1970 as short term measures after the great Earthquake of 1950. The life span of most of these embankments is already over. Accordingly, proposal for fortification of embankments of Brahmaputra river at a cost of Rs. 4454.09 crore has been submitted to Central Water Commission (CWC) for Techno- Economic appraisal.

This Department has given special emphasis on the flood and erosion problem of Majuli, the largest populated River Island in the World and has already started construction of a large fully fledged Water Resource Complex at Majuli which has already been completed.

- 1.6 The Department has taken up a Signature Project to rejuvenate the now defunct and dead Kollong river and accordingly, the WAPCOS was instructed with preparation of the DPR which has now been received. The departments has already taken up works components under this DPR in phases and works are in progress.
- 1.7 Earlier the State Government has already decided to procure dredger for Corrective Dredging. Accordingly, work order has been awarded against global tender for purchage of one dredger with other ancillary machineries. The Dredger has been already supplied by the supplier and the Dredging work has been taken up in Jiabharali river and dredging work is in progress.
- 1.8 For holistic management of river basis, the State Government earlier obtain the concurrence of DEA for Assam Integrated River Bank Management Project (AIRBMP) to be fund by World Bank Subsequently, scope of the project is scaled up and accordingly, the project cost is revised from 250M USD to 625 USD.

The revised PPR has been approved by the DEA . In principle, subject to concurrence of the line departments. The concurrence of line departments has been completed. The preparation of bid documents for civil work and other ancillary work components are in progress. The bid document for 2 (two) packages for Buridehing river and 1 (one) package for Beki river has already been floated. The phase-I of the AIRBMP has a loan provision of 125M USD.

- 1.9 The river Brahmaputra and Barak are the lifelines of Assam. This Government is making all efforts to convert these river sources into resources. Accordingly, Hon'ble Cabinet in its meeting held on 09/10/2018 instructed the WR Department to take up a pilot project on dredging. Accordingly, Department has initiated step of taking up feasibility study for a pilot project.
- 1.10 To accommodate resources required for maintaining the already executed flood management structure and to take up further work provision for fund is made under "Grant No. 63 in the State Budget to defray the expenditure of Water Resources Department of both Revenue and Capital Head.
- 1.11 After presentation the Budget Estimate to the House on 28<sup>th</sup> March 2022 the Departmentally Related Standing Committee on Work Department has scrutinized the demand for Grants for the financial year 2022-2023.
- 1.12 Budget Estimates under Grant No.63 Relating to Water Resources Department for the financial year 2022-2023 is as follows:

### **Rupees in Lakhs**

Out of the total Budget provision of Rs. 128261.01 lakhs, out of which Rs. 39335.44 lakhs and Rs. 88925.57 lakhs have been earmarked under Revenue and Capital head respectively. It seem from the Budget provision for the year 2022-2023 has been increased by an amount of Rs. 23,499.59 lakhs that of the revised budget estimates for the year 2022-23.

The Action Taken Report on the Recommendations made in the 23<sup>rd</sup> Report submitted by the Department is appended at Annexure-II.

# CHAPTER – II OBSERVATIONS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee has discussed thoroughly, the Budget provision reflected in Grant No. 63 & 44 related to Water Resources Department for the financial year 2022-2023. During the course of discussion the Committee feels that in some Heads the Budget provision is not sufficient to fulfill the execution of the works. After threadbare discussion, the Committee recommended the following

- 1. The Committee recommended to merge the Barak Valley Flood Control Project Project and Brahmaputra Flood Control Project with separate Salary Head.
- 2. The Committee recommended for budget allocation of Rs. 60 cr. And Rs. 40 cr. in connection with the Embankment of Brahmaputra Valley and Embankment of Barak Valley respectively in the financial year 2022-23.

However, there will be a requirement of revision of the Administrative Approvals in all the schemes as the budget head code mentioned in AA should match with the head under which fund is released. The Committee therefore directs Finance Department to keep the AA revision process easy and if possible, enable auto-revise process in the Fin. Assam portal. There need not be any requirement of concurrence of Finance Department or T&D Department, as the revisions will be due change of budget head code only.

3. During discussion, the Committee observed that in the Financial Year 2022-23, no budget provision is provided under the Head of Accounts No. 4711-01-800-4539-184-13-01 (SOPD-ODS) New Embankment at Brahmaputra Valley and 4711-01-800-4539-184-13-01 (SOPD-ODS) New Embankment at Barak Valley for Water Resource Department where liabilities were created in the Financial Year 2021-22.

Hence, the Committee recommends for a minimum budget provision in the aforesaid Head of Accounts, so that the department can move for SD proposal in due time for clearance of liabilities.

With these observations, the Committee recommends the total budget amount of Rs. 128261.01 lakhs as sought for under Grant No. 63 & 44 Water Resources Department for the Financial Year, 2022-23 be approved by the August House.

The Action Taken Report on the recommendation made in the report may be submitted to the Committee within 90 (ninety) days from the date of its presentation of the House.

No budget was approved for Renovation of Chief Engineer's Office Building for the year 2021-22. However, an amount of Rs. 0.01 Lakh has been sanctioned as CF Advance. Further, an amount of Rs. 1.11 Crore has been proposed for the financial year 2022-23 for the same for clearing outstanding liability.
